ORDER OF WORSHIP

The Lutheran church is a liturgical church. Lutherans believe that the gospel is not only good news that Jesus has saved sinners, but also a power God uses to create and strengthen faith in Jesus. Lutheran worship places the gospel in central focus in an order of service called the liturgy. In message and meal (Holy Communion), in specially selected Bible readings, and in carefully crafted songs, prayers, and confessions, the liturgy points to Jesus as the Savior of all.

GATHERING RITE FOR REFORMATION 1

Stand

- M In the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- Welcome to the house of the Lord. Welcome to the place where God comes to us in Word and feeds us with his love. Dear Christians, one and all, rejoice to be in his presence!
- Dear Christians, one and all, rejoice, with exultation springing,
 And, with united heart and voice and holy rapture singing,
 Proclaim the wonders God has done, how his right arm the vict'ry won.
 How dearly it has cost him!
- M God has called us to love him and to serve him as his dear children. But we have not obeyed that call. In our words and actions, in our thoughts and feelings, we have sinned against God. Therefore, we deserve his punishment both now and in eternity.
- Fast bound in Satan's chains I lay; death brooded darkly o'er me. Sin was my torment night and day; in sin my mother bore me. Yet deep and deeper still I fell; life had become a living hell, So firmly sin possessed me.

My own good works availed me naught, no merit they attaining; My will against God's judgment fought, no hope for me remaining. My fears increased till sheer despair left naught but death to be my share And hell to be my sentence.

¹ This Gathering Rite incorporates Martin Luther's hymn, "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice" (CW 377). This was Luther's first congregational hymn, about which Tileman Hesshusius wrote, "I do not doubt that through this one hymn of Luther many hundreds of Christians have been brought to the true faith who before could not endure the name of Luther; but the noble, precious words of the hymn have won their hearts, so that they are constrained to embrace the truth.

- M But where sin abounds, grace does all the more! Before the world began, God's grace moved him to rescue us.
- But God beheld my wretched state before the world's foundation, And, mindful of his mercies great, he planned my soul's salvation. A Father's heart he turned to me, sought my redemption fervently; He gave his dearest treasure.
- In time, God sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sin. Christ Jesus did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant.
- He spoke to his beloved Son: "Tis time to have compassion.
 Then go, bright Jewel of my crown, and bring mankind salvation.
 From sin and sorrow set them free; slay bitter death for them that they May live with you forever."

The Son obeyed his Father's will, was born of virgin mother, And, God's good pleasure to fulfill, he came to be my brother. No garb of pomp or pow'r he wore; a servant's form like mine he bore To lead the devil captive.

- Therefore, at Christ's command and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son +, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- To me he spoke, "Hold fast to me— I am your rock and castle.
 Your ransom I myself will be; for you I strive and wrestle.
 For I am yours, your friend divine, and evermore you shall be mine;
 The foe shall not divide us.

"The foe shall shed my precious blood, me of my life bereaving. All this I suffer for your good; be steadfast and believing. Life shall from death the vict'ry win; my innocence shall bear your sin, And you are blest forever.

- M Now reigning in heaven, Jesus has sent his Spirit into our hearts through the gospel. Through that gospel, the Comforter guides us in truth and brings us real peace. Therefore, cling to that gospel! Proclaim that gospel!
- "Now to my Father I depart, the Holy Spirit sending
 And, heav'nly wisdom to impart, my help to you extending.
 He will a source of comfort be, teach you to know and follow me,
 And in all truth will guide you.

"What I on earth have lived and taught be all your life and teaching; So shall my kingdom's work be wrought and honored in your preaching. Take care that no one's man-made laws should e'er destroy the gospel's cause. This final word I leave you."

CONFESSION OF FAITH

Augsburg Confession—Article V—The Ministry ²

- M So that we may obtain the faith, the ministry of teaching the gospel and administering the sacraments was instituted.
- Through the Word and the sacraments, as through instruments, the Holy Spirit is given.
- M He works faith, when and where it pleases God, in those who hear the good news that God justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake.
- This happens not through our own merits, but for Christ's sake.

Augsburg Confession—Article VII—The Church³

- M Our churches teach that one holy Church is to remain forever.
- The Church is the congregation of saints in which the Gospel is purely taught and the sacraments are correctly administered.
- For the true unity of the Church it is enough to agree about the doctrine of the gospel and the administration of the sacraments.
- It is not necessary that human traditions, that is, rites or ceremonies instituted by men, should be the same everywhere. As Paul says, "One Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all."

² How can what Christ did for us 2,000 years ago have any effect today? Some imagined they would experience the Holy Spirit by their own reflections, through nature, or by ecstatic religious experience. The comforting truth is that the Holy Spirit works through objective, external, sure, and certain means of grace, through which we receive justification by grace and through faith alone.

³ This article of faith has been called the "Magna Carta" of the Lutheran Church and defines the church with eloquent simplicity. Church fellowship is common participation in the saving treasures of the Church: Christ's gifts, his gospel, and his sacraments. Not any "gospel" will do, but only that gospel which is purely taught alongside correctly administered sacraments.

M Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

Brief silence

- M Lord God, heavenly Father, you are our mighty fortress. In you we find our strength, our protection and our peace through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Through the shield of faith, protect us from the flaming arrows of the evil one, knowing that with the sword of the Word of God the gates of hell cannot prevail against us. Now, we pray, help us in our every need. Lord, in your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- The old evil foe has sworn to harm us, to deceive us and to lead us away from you, O Lord. His attacks are strong from without, his inroads into the Church are often subtle. We cannot fight him or resist him in our own strength. We cannot conquer him with our good works or with our own power. On earth is not his equal. We praise you for sending Jesus,

who fights for us. Through his holy cross, Jesus has forever conquered Satan, toppling his kingdom of darkness and setting us free. Protect your Church, purchased by the blood of Jesus, from Satan's attacks. Continue to raise up faithful ministers, warriors in your Kingdom, who proclaim Jesus and his cross as our only hope and joy. Lord, in your mercy,

- C hear our prayer.
- All have sinned and fallen short of your glory, O Lord. Good works could not avert our doom. But as your strong Word cleaved the darkness with light at your creation, it also pronounces us righteous at the baptismal font. It is there where you made us your own, granted us faith and clothed us with your robe of righteousness. Cause us to return to our baptism each day through the confession of our sins, holding firmly to your promise that we are justified by faith apart from works of the law. Lord, in your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- O Dayspring from on high, splendor of light everlasting, in your love for us you came into this world, swallowed by the eternal night of sin and death, as the Light of light. Through your Church, continue to shine the gospel into this present darkness. Remove all that would obscure your light from us: the temptation to turn your gift into an earned wage, the urge of trusting the false light from within instead of the true light from above, and the despair of unbelief that comprehends neither light nor hope. Send out your light and your truth in your Church, and let them bring us to your holy hill. Lord, in your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- M Lord, you have charged your Church with the work of angels, to proclaim your eternal gospel to all who dwell on earth, to sing good news to every people, tribe, language and nation. Let your Word not come back to you empty, but accomplish that which you desire, leading forth in joy all who trust in you. Lord, in your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- M O Bread of life from heaven, you have given us life. Your truth has set us free. As we feast upon your body and blood, we rejoice in the freedom of sonship that comes through the forgiveness of sins. Lord, in your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.
- M All honor and glory are yours, Almighty Father, with the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto the ages of ages.
- C Amen.

THE SACRAMENT

The churches of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) practice close communion. We ask, therefore, that only members of WELS congregations and of our fellowship partake of the Lord's Supper.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION



- C Amen.


LAMB OF GOD





DISTRIBUTION

Holy Communion is served by continuous distribution. At the direction of the ushers, approach the minister serving the host, pause, and receive the body of the Lord. Move to the minister serving the chalice, pause, and receive the blood of the Lord. Communicants may assist the minister with the chalice and say "Amen" after receiving each of the elements. Worshipers may alternatively take an individual cup from the assisting minister. The blessing follows the distribution.
